WHAT IS FACEBOOK?



Facebook is hugely popular social networking site that allows you to make connection, share interests and joint groups.

Different than Twitter as it has a lot more personal usage and security controls.

FACEBOOK TERMINOLOGY



- Creating a Timeline or Facebook Group to support the teaching of any curriculum subject
- Creating a space and platform for homework and revision resources
- Running debates on topical issues and hot issues in the media



FORMAL LEARNING ONE



- Friend people you connect with on Facebook
- Newsfeed where your status updates are shown as well as your friends
- Like a button under statuses or pictures, way to share positive feedback
- Timeline list status updates from your Newsfeed, photos you post and places you visited in chronological order.

FORMAL LEARNING TWO



- Peer tutoring and support
- A research tool to post, share ideas, videos and resources
- Creating Groups in schools to make life easier for teachers and staff



INFORMAL LEARNING ONE



- Organizing a sports team or after school club
- Pastoral care making new pupils feel at home at school or college
- Creating and designing digital making activities including App creation



INFORMAL LEARNING TWO



- Organizing TeachMeets
- Informal support from friends (likes) for projects and other activities
- Uploading social and video podcasts to students/peers



WIDER APPLICATIONS ONE



- A 'broadcast account' with parents, carers and the community
- Enabling language students to converse with exchange partners overseas
- Engaging hard to reach learners through online learning

WIDER APPLICATIONS TWO



- Providing inspiration in life skills and enrichment subjects
- Engaging young people in youth and community settings
